Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Definitions

Definitions used by the United States Department of Education

Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter: The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Robbery: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force, violence, and/or causing the victim fear.

Aggravated Assault: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. It is not necessary that injury result from an aggravated assault when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could or probably would result in a serious potential injury if the crime were successfully completed.

Burglary: The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

Motor Vehicle Theft: The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. Classify as motor vehicle theft all cases where persons not having lawful access even though the vehicles are later abandoned. Includes joyriding.

Arson: Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud a dwelling, house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property, etc. . .

Negligent Manslaughter: The killing of another human being through gross negligence.

Alcohol Law Violations: The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting: The manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, or possessing of any intoxicating liquor or malt beverage; Maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing alcohol to minors or intemperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of alcohol; drinking on a train or public conveyance; all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.

Drug Law Violations: Violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs. The relevant substances include: Opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine); Marijuana; Synthetic narcotics (demerol, methadone's); and dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbituates, benzedrine).

Weapon Law Violations: The violation of laws or ordinances dealing with weapon offenses, regulatory in nature, such as: Manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; aliens possessing deadly weapons; all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.

Location Definitions: "The Handbook for Campus Crime Reporting"

On Campus: (1)Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area and used by the institution in direct support of or in a manner related to the institution's educational purposes, including residence halls and/or

(2)any building or property that is within or reasonably contiguous to the area identified in paragraph (1) that is owned by the institution but controlled by another person and is frequently used by students and supports institutional purposes; (such as food or retail vendor).

Non-Campus: (1)Any building or property owned or controlled by a student organization that is officially recognized by the institution and/or

(2)Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution that is used in direct support of or in relation to the institution's educational purposes, is frequently used by students, and is not within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution.

Public Property: All public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, that is within the campus or immediately adjacent to and accessible from campus residential facilities.

NOTE: Dormitories or other campus resident housing facilities for students on campus is a subset of the "On Campus" category.

Hate/Bias Crimes: Any crime (or any other crimes involving injury to any person) where the victim was intentionally selected because of his/her actual or perceived race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity or disability, should be reported to the Office of Public Safety.
